- **Wahroonga Netball Club:** Jo-Anne became a member of Wahroonga Netball Club in 1991. During her over 30 years of membership, she has held many various positions, including Grading Committee 1995-2021, Vice President 1997-2001, Treasurer 2000-2005, Club Coaching Convenor 2001, Mentor to coaches 2002-2022, Grading Convenor 2007 and President 2002-2012. In 2009, Jo-Anne was made a life member of the WNC and in 2016, in recognition of her long and valued service, she was nominated as Patron of Wahroonga Netball Club.
- **At Ku ring-gai Association Level:** Jo-Anne has fulfilled many roles for KNA over the years, including Grading Convenor 2002-2005, Executive Member 2006-2011, Vice President 2011, Appointments Panel 2013-2022, Remuneration Panel 2013-2022, Junior Selector 2004-2009, and President from 2013 to 2022. As President, Jo-Anne has been the driving force behind a number of initiatives, including the finalization of the long outstanding Council Plan of Management for our courts, the gaining of a commitment from Council to install lights at the Canon Rd complex, the celebrations for our 50th anniversary and the introduction of a KNA Hall of Fame to recognize people who have made an extraordinary contribution to the Association.
- **At State Level:** Jo-Anne played a major role in bringing together the North Shore United franchise for the Ku-ring- gai and Northern Suburbs Netball Associations. Her contribution has been crucial in the success of the franchise during its first early years. Because of her efforts, an extremely solid base was created, so that the franchise can look forward and plan for the next five years.

Jo-Anne has also been called on by Netball NSW to be a member and at different times Chair their Disputes Committee, which covers all disputes raised by Associations throughout New South Wales. She has also been on the NNSW Competitions Panel and was a recipient of the prestigious NNSW Anne Clark Award in 2019.

We wish to thank Jo-Anne for everything she has done for our Association over the years and wish her well in her future endeavours.

6.1 President's Report:

6.2 Treasurer’s Report:

KNA continues to be financially healthy thanks to substantial bank balances built over the years. At 30 Sept 2022 total cash held was \$1.6 million. The provisional unaudited surplus for the 2022 financial year was \$15,000.

PLAYER NUMBERS

The 2021 Spring Competition and proposed Twilight Competition were cancelled due to COVID but happily, the 2022 Winter Competition was played in full.

Player numbers were the lowest in recent history. Net Set Go numbers are low compared to five years ago. There was also drop off in the Seniors, Cadets and 10s

CAPITAL EXPENDITURE & GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Solar car park lighting at Canoon Road was completed by Ku-ring-gai Council. KNA contributed \$20,000 to the project – about 30% of the total cost.

KNA is lobbying for resurfacing of the Lofberg courts which are dangerously slippery when wet. Longer term, a new building at Canoon Road continues to be the main goal. KNA received two government grants this year - \$4080 for volunteer uniforms and \$1000 COVID relief.

The Building Provision holds \$219,144.

PLAYHQ

The introduction of PlayHQ for player registration was a mixed blessing. We understand NNSW is working with the provider to iron out the flaws. Deregistrations were a particular problem and deregistered players had to wait many months for a refund.

CANTEEN & BBQ

Canteen sales were down this year resulting in a \$5619 loss – not helped by the jettison of aged stock due to lockdown. We need to review canteen product lines and promotion to make it profitable again.

The BBQ continues to be a solid fundraiser for the junior rep program.



COUNCIL CHARGES

This year Ku-ring-gai Council began charging KNA for use of the complex building at Canoon Road. KNA now has to pay around \$5500 per year for the privilege of using a building that was largely funded by the netball community.

AUDIT

Audited Financial Statements will be available by the time of the AGM. Attached is a management report for the information of members, based on unaudited accounts. At the time of writing, we still await final court charges from council. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions about the report or any financial matter.

NEXT YEAR

We look forward to lots of netball, including a Twilight comp in Feb-Mar 2023 and encouragement of more male players. The 2023 budget will be available at the AGM.

6.4 KNA All Stars – All Abilities Report:

35 players (including 6 men) registered for the 2022 All Abilities netball season. 6 sessions were cancelled due to wet weather leaving 12 sessions to be played. Unfortunately, wet weather also caused the cancellation of 2 pre-season training sessions with North Shore United.

Despite the wet season 2022 was a great success overall. The annual All Abilities carnival was played on the second date option (wet for first option) and KNA reigned as carnival champions. I was aided this year by 5 coaches (Nick Hill, Carolyn Sinclair, Bri Mills, Millie McKenzie and Kayla Artindale) as well as All Abilities manager Janet Heberden. The continued support of Jo Perry and the KNA Executive (special mention to David Funk) is very much appreciated.

The All Abilities was again included in the lowest level opens competition. Unfortunately, there was ongoing problems with our opposition teams supplying less than 7 players each week. Many weeks were spent by us frantically looking for extra players to help them make up the numbers. This needs to be addressed for 2023 but I suggest placing us into an alternate division where fresh opposition players may be more enthusiastic. We can play in any division at the 2:10pm timeslot that has only 7 teams. We should also enforce the policy of the opposition team receiving no points if they do not supply 7 players.

A second group of All Abilities players received 30 minutes of coaching and then played against an invitational team on court 21 each week. A huge thankyou to the following clubs who helped by supplying players for the invitational team each week – Lindfield, West Pymble, Kissing Point, Wahroonga and North Shore United.

The mainstream competition and invitational team initiative is fantastic as it allows the Abilities players to really feel like they are playing a genuine competition game, their skills are dramatically improved and the joyful opportunity to play against the All Abilities is given to so many KNA mainstream players.

The remaining All Abilities players were coached and played against themselves on court 20. These players were our lowest ability level players with many requiring help and instruction for every move on the court. This was a very intense coaching experience but the improvement over the season, whilst slow, was promising.

Thanks also to the KNA umpires who umpired the Opens game each week as well as those who umpired at the All-Abilities carnival.

It was evident this year that 35 players are the maximum number that can be catered for in the All-Abilities program. There will be no additional payers added to the group in 2023 unless



other players opt not to return. And even then, it is important that consideration be given to the ability level of new players to ensure that the volunteer coaches can manage.

After a lot of work by myself with many different Netball NSW staff members over the last 10 years it was very exciting this year to finally have Netball NSW Melanie Chapman officially announce at the KNA All Abilities carnival that an All-Abilities division would be included for the first time in the 2023 Senior State Titles. Unfortunately, Melanie along with several other key staff members have since resigned and All Abilities has clearly dropped off the priority list. The battle continues....

6.8 Fixtures Report:

As voted on at the 2021 AGM, the winter season again this year started after the Autumn School



holidays. This is preferred by the clubs as it allows more time pre-season to prepare. It also means no 2-games, followed by 3 weeks off scenario. This meant the Winter season had a two week overlap with the Spring competition. Later in the season, at the time of arranging the Spring Competition the committee realized that this was problematic as teams were still using courts for training for the final's series. Starting the Spring Season prior to start of Daylight Savings was also problematic as, with no access to the lights at Canoon Courts outside of the winter competition, the games scheduled for 6pm would not be able to be played as there would be no light. It was therefore decided to start the Spring Competition after the Spring (October) school holidays. This meant running the program up until mid-December to allow the full 10 weeks of play. Teams can find this challenging due to the end of year/school festivities and holidays. If the later start for both the winter and spring competition is voted on for next season, some thought may need to go into the length of the Spring Competition. Maybe reducing it to an 8- or 9-week competition.

A Twilight series that had been scheduled in February and March was abandoned due to the Covid pandemic.

Due to wet weather our NetSetGo and 9s competition both lost a number of days play. We manually added two extra games for NetSetGo 7s & 8s and one extra week for the 9s to ensure they played a near full season.

This year was the first year KNA used the computer program PlayHQ for administrating the competitions. From a fixtures point of view there was both a positive and a negative moving to PlayHQ. In general, the system is more user friendly and simpler to use then MyNetball. It however has significant limitations for anything 'outside the box' such as our re-grading and Short Grades Day. For KNA the biggest issue was with our re-grading after week 5. This was very problematic. The system does not cater for a change of team numbers in a grade and starts afresh the scheduling of a fixture if the number of teams in a grade changes. E.g., going from an 8- to a 7-team grade. For this season it meant that some teams played others 3 times, whilst another team only once. The only work around is manually doing a fixture if there is a change in team numbers within a grade. With the limited time available between re-grade (day 5) and the following week of play this is not possible. It is also not possible to create the fixtures for week 1-5 only and then add on 6-14 post re-grade as could previously be done in MyNetball.

We successfully held a number of Gala Days. The NetSetGo Gala Day had 57 teams participate and the Junior Gala Day had 35 teams participate. Team numbers were down from previous years unfortunately however the participants much enjoyed the days.

6.9 Grading Report:

Winter Competition:

This season 271 teams registered from Net Set Go through to Seniors.

- Senior teams: 60



- Junior teams: 156 (10 years – Cadets)
- Net Set Go: 55 (6-9 years)

There was a decrease in team numbers in all divisions as follows:

- Seniors – 15 teams
- Cadets – 7 teams
- Inters – 2 teams
- 12 Years – 2 teams
- 11 Years – 2 teams
- 10 Years – 4 teams
- 9 Years – 1 team
- NSG – Same as 2021

Regrading was finalised after Game/Day 5 with only 14 teams being regraded.

NSG – Lofberg: Grading was slightly better this year; however, it is still challenging when some teams can only play at certain times, due to other commitments & coaches' availability.

Feedback received from parents is that the courts are very slippery & dangerous to play on. Other feedback received as follows:

I think a 1-pager for each age group/grade on what the key rules are, and skills would be beneficial and have that updated on KNA website.

Have reminders with the scoresheets for example - that parents and coaches shouldn't be on the baseline and that only the coach is allowed to walk up and down sideline. Only persons to go on the court are the umpire and coach.

Have coach and umpire sessions in Feb and have an indoor venue available in case of rain. Would suggest that umpires must do a session before the season as there was a lot of variability in umpiring.

Difficult recruiting the 7/8yrs NSG as we can't give the times until after registration. I'm not sure how this is resolved, but the same questions are raised each year - I think this year was especially difficult with parents' hesitation with younger kids post Covid lockdowns and getting them back into activities etc

If 7/8s have to wait until registration to find out their time slot, then maybe it should be fair that the older teams such as 9s must accept grade changes in the season (and move time slots). Our 9C team CC4 is top of the grade C and should have been given the opportunity to move up a grade - it was a B grade team that apparently couldn't move down as the time slot didn't suit.

We accept that grading is difficult at this age group as the kids improve at very different rates over the season.



Umpiring and strictness (travelling, contact etc) varied greatly between B and C grade of the 9yrs program. 9C feedback was that they needed little more guidance by the umpires if they were pulled up for something and also encouraged the correct player to take the throw in etc. 9Cs (our own players also) were rarely pulled up for travelling which is something we feel needs to be introduced and 10s umpires become very diligent about this.

How do we better manage kids who are sick with Covid / flu related symptoms with restricted grading / borrowing - this might require more players in general in a team - this is difficult in our very small club (most of our teams only have 7 players).

10s program is a big step up with ability - how can the umpires' better control and monitor rough playing in games? We have seen this in a couple of games in the B grade.

Spring Competition:

After an issue with the lights and the cross over with Winter & Spring Competitions, it was decided to start after the school holidays.

There are 109 teams registered to play this year. However, team Numbers are down, in particular the Ladies Competition. Feedback received was that the ladies won't play at Lofberg as it's too dangerous, so many are playing at Hills or an Indoor Competition. Numbers are growing in the junior competition as they play at Canoon with more courts and a safer playing surface.

Ladies Comp – 19 teams, Senior Mixed – 20 teams, Cadet Mixed – 5 teams, Inters/Mixed – 18 teams, 11/12 Years – 24 teams, 9/10 Years – 23 teams

Special thanks to the wonderful 2022 Committee: Liz Bromley, Belinda Kelly, Jen Maneschi, Jill Martin, and Fiona Rondeau.

I would also like to thank Tanya Sinclair, Katie Bonjer, Ros Roots, Brenda Williams, and Jo-Anne Perry for their continued support during the season.

- We have several regular paid advertisers and could attract more, but that would mean



less news or more pages and consequently higher costs. A balancing act which would need to be carefully considered.

Distribution of hard copies

This is an important but neglected aspect of the newsletter and I believe that it is vital that we have a wider distribution reach for two reasons:

- In order to attract potential sponsors, volunteers, advertisers and members we need to raise the profile of KNA in the general community. The newsletter and media coverage (which is sporadic and beyond our control) are the only channels of communication that we have to reach this important target demographic
- The newsletter is an appealing sponsorship benefit for existing and potential sponsors and our sponsorship agreements stipulate that we are obliged to print 300x hard copies and distribute them.

Events and Community Projects

An individual communications plan was devised for each event/project.

Social Media Workshop

In Feb 2022 - KNA hosted a free zoom social media workshop for clubs which was presented by Holly of Engage 323.

Annual Pymble Shore cake sale

March 22 saw the Pymble -Shore Cake sale - at Canoon Rd where over \$4000 was raised for their Sony camp initiative

Visit from SES

In April we hosted a visit by the SES who visited KNA as part of their community engagement project.

Crazy Hair & Sock Day

CH&S Day, which is our main community project, took place in June. A total of \$3458 was raised for the Kids Cancer Project. This year the event was divided into three segments:

The main event took place at Canoon Road and Lofberg on June 05, 2022

The Nines held their Crazy under Lights competition on June 09.

There was also a "mini" CH&S competition which was held later, for those clubs that had a bye on June 05.

Other format changes this year:

The main difference this year was that:

- Entrants paid by cash or with credit card
- They then took their own photographs and emailed them in together with their entry forms

This had an impact on judging which we hadn't taken into consideration. Next year we will change the entry form which may make things easier.

Publicity:

The event was publicized in the newsletter and on social media

A flyer/poster, entry form and set of instructions were produced

A message was sent out to Club presidents and Secretaries



After the event photos and info were sent to Belinda for social media purposes
Photos also appeared in the next newsletter together with details of winners
My thanks go to Michelle Rae for running the Lofberg segment and Keri Sheraton for assisting me at Canoon Rd plus David Funk for his input re improving the judging system.

Coffee and conversations with Kyds

Originally planned to take place at the Open Day prior to the start of the season, this was a joint project with the Turrumurra and Lindfield Community Banks and KYDS. The Banks donated \$2 for every cup of coffee sold (a sum of \$1250 was raised) and KYDS team were there to provide information to parents on the importance of having regular conversations with their children. The Banks also donated \$1000 towards our BBQ supplies and added to the fun with prizes and guessing competitions.

Team Photos Trial

Introduced as a trial towards the end of the season, the objective was to encourage players to return next year. This project had three variations:

- Team photos at Canoon Rd - bookings with the photographer made on request. Feedback from those that participated was positive
- The Nines under lights – All teams participated, and the response was excellent.
- NetSetGO – Bookings by request with the opportunity to have photos taken with the Bendigo “Piggy” character. Feedback from participants was positive.

If we repeat this in 2023, we need to begin earlier, get Clubs involved and publicize it more. My thanks to Michelle Rae for her assistance with the NetSetGO photos.

Spring Competition

Archive Initiative

Over the last few years, we have lost touch with a few of our Life Members and others have sadly passed away - taking their knowledge and memories of our Association with them. As we head towards our 55th anniversary, I believe that it is important that we establish a permanent record of our history for future KNA members.

Prior to COVID I liaised with Jessica Graham (who is the Ku-ring-gai Council Local History Librarian) with a view to establishing an archive of KNA material, to be held permanently at the Gordon Library. The Council expressed an interest in proceeding, but I was unable to pursue the project due to the challenges of the past couple of years. I hope to get it going in 2023.

6.12 Member Protection Report:

Consistent with Netball NSW's Member Protection Policy, the KNA is committed to ensuring that the safety and welfare of children is paramount.

The current season has been relatively quiet with respect to issues arising through the year, but I provide a brief summary below.

Nationalized Scheme for WWCC

From 1 September 2022 changes were made to the legislation to create a national database of the working with children checks ('WWCC') which is called the National Reference System ('NRS'). The NRS was established by the Federal Government and is now managed by the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission.

The purpose of the new nationalized scheme is to permit a cross-border checks of the WWCC to ensure that persons moving from one jurisdiction to another are monitored.

Furthermore, it is now a legislative requirement that all 'Heads' of organizations must also have a WWCC.

The changes to the WWCC is consistent with a greater Federal approach that has been undertaken since 1 July 2020 when Sport Integrity Australia assumed responsibility for child safeguarding in sport.

Support Material

The NSW Office of the Children's Guardian published and refined their assistance materials which has included the Child Safe Handbooks. These documents provide some assistance with respect to specific policies and procedures which must be implemented and augments the wealth of support material from Netball NSW.

NSW Child Safe Scheme

From 1 February 2022 the '10 Child Safe Scheme' came into operation in NSW. It involves the implementation of 10 Child Safe Standards following on from the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. The 10 standards are as follows:

- Leadership and Culture;
- Children's participation;
- Families and communities;
- Equity and diversity;
- Suitability of workers;
- Complaint handling;
- Knowledge and skills;
- Physical and online environments;
- Continuous improvement;

Policies and procedures.

On 5 April 2022 I attended a lecture from the Office of Children's Guardian during which the 10 standards were discussed. (The 10 standards can be found



https://ocg.nsw.gov.au/sites/default/files/2021-12/g_CSS_GuidetotheStandards.pdf.)

Essentially, nothing has changed but the 10 standards are an attempt to simply articulate the requirements of a sports organization to ensure the safety of children and place them in one reference document.

Photography and filming

It was necessary throughout 2022 season to reinforce the photography and filming policy. The Netball NSW Photography Policy states that prior to any photography or filming commencing the person must seek the approval of both Managers of the teams. If either Manager does not provide consent, then the filming or photography cannot be taken. The KNA policy is found at https://www.kna.com.au/files/ugd/a0c038_d6a81ff40051454fb2fa67f39bac5266.pdf. It must also be borne in mind that West Pymble will not permit any photography at any time.

GENERAL OVERVIEW:

Personnel

2022 saw all players and staff as outstanding representatives for NSU. The Franchise had an exceptionally successful year. Kim Green OAM had her first full year as coach of the Opens team after a disrupted 2021, with Lisa Duncan as Assistant Coach. Dylan Nexhip - NSU training partner and Australian Men's Captain, also contributed significantly over the season as a Specialist Defensive coach. Robyn Bramwell was appointed as Open's Manager. High Performance accredited Coach Colleen Mitchell headed up the Under 23's with newly appointed Michelle Bullock as assistant coach. Jo-Anne Perry was appointed as manager of the 23's. For the first time NSU appointed an Apprentice coach to the Under 23's for the 2022 season – Leigh-Anne Hartwig.

Season 2022

In 2022, NSU had an extremely successful year.

The Opens finished top of the table and went on to win the Grand final v Central Coast Heart 62-51. This is a brilliant result for a team that finished top of the table in 2021 before a COVID interrupted season and were also winners of the 2020 competition.

In 2022 this team comprised 15 athletes in the contracted team with an addition of 4 training partners. Our 4 training partners consisted of some youth, experience, and inclusivity.

Again, NSU was at the forefront of player development during 2022. For the first time in Premier League history, NSU had two NSW men's representatives who brought so much on and off the court to this team whilst also preparing themselves for Nationals which were held in Adelaide in April.



It was an outstanding year for an outstanding group of players. NSU player Eliza Burton was announced MVP for the Premier League season and NSU's Emily Moore player of the Grand Final.

With some of the 2021 Under 23's players being offered positions in the Opens team for 2022, the Under 23's team of 2022 were a young team ready to take on the higher level of Premier League Netball. This team continued to develop strongly through the season and we are looking forward to the growth of this team during 2023.

NSU would like to acknowledge the great co-operation of the Metro coaches of both Associations for their co-operation and willingness to work with the NSU franchise.


