6.1 President's Report:

Jo-Anne's advocacy has been an invaluable sounding board all year and it has been a pleasure to work with her in passing on the baton.

Joining the KNA Executive, I never realised how many people are involved in the running of the Association. This includes the KNA members who work specifically at association level and to the members of all 11 clubs. So many games are played each week, a massive thanks must go toward the volunteers and employees who work tirelessly to ensure that each person entering our courts has an enjoyable time. I must give specific acknowledgement to our umpires in a role that is regarded by many as the most difficult in netball.

go to our grounds team who operate efficiently to ensure we have some amazing courts to play on each week. Without them looking after our courts, the netball experience we have each weekend will be very different. Additionally, our canteen staff and volunteers at Canoon Road should also be acknowledged, as feeding around all the parents, siblings, and extended family members that turn out to cheer on their loved ones each weekend, is no easy feat.

Lastly, I would just like to pass on my congratulations to the men's/boys' teams that are beginning to bolster our KNA playing numbers. Our main Open Men's team were very successful this year, taking out the NSW State Titles played over the long weekend. We hope to see this side of participation continue to grow in the near future.

Review of new ideas

In 2023 the KNA executive elected to try out some new ideas to create a greater atmosphere for everyone down at the courts during the week or on weekends.

- We had Back to Netball Day at the start of the season which incorporated U9 Grading, Umpires, and Club Training. The feedback we received from this was all very positive, particularly from those that were new to the sport of netball or new to KNA.
- The introduction of the Thursday night barbecue at Canoon for the U9's.
- 2023 also saw markets and stalls making their way onto the sidelines of our Canoon Road courts.
- Continuing with this change, we also brought in the rule of Supershot, something that is played in the Suncorp Super Netball league. We received plenty of feedback, mostly positive and we will be using all the suggestion into next season.



- We had a celebration day on the last day of the regular season to in particular support the teams that were not participating in finals.
- The Grand Final Day format was also changed and in attempt to add to the occasion, we hired a DJ that played in breaks in play, a stage, and a bar for spectators to use.
- Lastly, to build on our participation and diversification goals, we added a father/daughter and an all-boys competition in Spring.

Closing remarks

Personally, I am looking forward to a great 2024 where the KNA executive team will continue to provide this organisation with the best ideas and strategies to continue our prominence as one of NSW’s leading netball associations.

6.2 Treasurer’s Report:

KNA is financially healthy thanks to substantial bank balances built over the years. At 30 Sept 2023 total cash held was \$1.64 million.

The audited financial statements will be available prior to the AGM. An unaudited summary follows at the end of this report.

The unaudited FY23 accounts show a deficit of around \$7,000. A small surplus would be preferable, but the deficit is not significant. (It would have been a surplus but for some 2022 bills that arrived late).

Our long-term financial health depends on us maintaining or growing our player numbers.

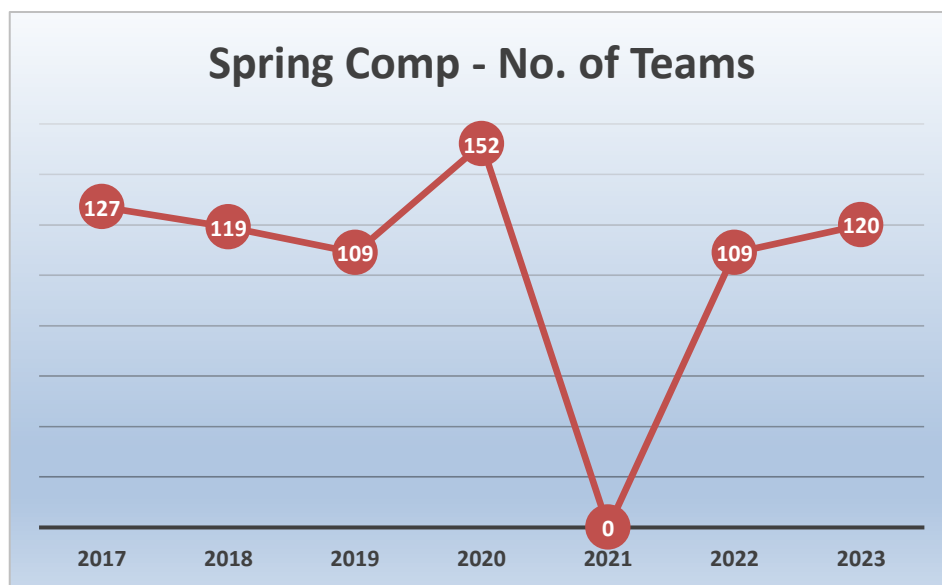
PLAYER NUMBERS

PLAYER FEES

Netball NSW has made some welcome decisions on fees. Firstly, they have removed the \$50 charge for non-players. Secondly there is now an option for a three-month NNSW membership which might suit Spring Comp players.

For KNA Winter Comp fees we recommend a 5% increase (\$4) in line with inflation and in line with NNSW fees. We believe we will remain competitive with other sports.

Spring Comp fees can be decided next year in consultation with the clubs. We may need to reduce the Spring Comp fee to compete with other sports and netball associations.

CAPITAL EXPENDITURE & GOVERNMENT GRANTS

KNA had no substantial capital expenditure this year. Ku-ring-gai Council did however resurface the Lofberg courts which were dangerously slippery and are much improved.

The Capital Expenditure Committee will report on plans for Canon Road.



KNA successfully applied for two grants from Ku-ring-gai Council which will be received next year - \$3700 for migrant outreach and \$1600 for equipment.

The Building Provision holds \$244,930.

CANTEEN & BBQ

The BBQ continues to be a solid fundraiser making \$19,586. However, the canteen made another loss. Sales increased 21% but costs also increased for an overall loss of \$4,802. The canteen is an important service, but we will need to work on getting it back in the black.

6.3 KNA All Stars – All Abilities Report:

30 players (including 4 men) registered for the 2023 All Abilities netball season. It was a tough start to the season with 3 of the first 5 sessions cancelled due to wet weather. Perhaps because of the early cancellations, combined with the stop start nature of the first half of the season due to Easter and school holidays it was difficult to build committed attendance momentum within the group until the second half of the season. This was frustrating.

I was aided this year by 6 coaches (Nick Hill, Carolyn Sinclair, Bree Mills, Garry Cornius, Bree Mills, Keeva O'Kelly, and JoJo Ricketts) as well as All Abilities manager Janet Heberden. The support of Rod Jackson and the KNA Executive (special mention to David, Tanya, and Rhoda all of whom will be much missed) is very much appreciated.



The All Abilities was again included in the lowest level opens competition – this year B4. I'm happy to report that supply of full teams for us to play against was much improved this year. This may have been because we were playing against players/teams who had not necessarily played against us year after year and so were more enthusiastic and committed to support the program. It is vital prior to every season to provide information to the teams in the mainstream division we are included in to make sure that they are understanding of expectations and our appreciation of them.

A second group of All Abilities players received 30 minutes of coaching and then played against an invitational team on court 21 each week. A huge thankyou to all the clubs who helped by supplying players for the invitational team each week.

The mainstream competition and invitational team initiative is fantastic as it allows the All-Abilities players to really feel like they are playing a genuine competition game, their skills are dramatically improved and the joyful opportunity to play against the All-Stars is given to the wider KNA community.

The remaining All Abilities players were coached and played against themselves and support workers on court 20. These players are generally our lowest ability level players with many requiring help and instruction for every move on the court. This is a very intense coaching experience but the improvement over the season, whilst slow, was promising.

Thanks also to the KNA umpires who umpired the Opens game each week as well as those who umpired at the State Titles and KNA All Abilities carnival.

It was incredibly exciting to compete in the inaugural All Abilities Division at the 2023 State Titles held in Newcastle. A strong team of 8 All-Star players were incredibly proud to represent KNA and win the competition. The initiative of Netball NSW to provide a bus for transport was a 'gamechanger' and will hopefully be offered again for 2024.

The annual KNA All Abilities carnival was held on 27th August and was a fantastic success. With approximately 80 All Abilities players attending there was a lot of fun had in a very supportive atmosphere. KNA were once again proud champions.

It was evident again this year that great care must be taken in any expansion of the All-Abilities program. Whilst there is room for a few more players it is very important that consideration be given to the ability level of new players to ensure that the volunteer coaches can manage support requirements of the players.

6.5 Boys Competition Report:

KNA have a strong standing in the Men’s Netball environment, however, have not previously promoted boys in the Junior competitions. Individual boys have played occasionally in the Junior U12 competitions, however, there have been no previous competitions to drive boys’ participation.

In 2023, KNA called for interest for an U14 Boys State Titles Team, however only 3 boys completed the nomination form. KNA connected these 3 boys with Manly Netball Association who had 5 boys



nominate. These 8 boys, with a further 3 who signed up later, formed a team under Manly Association and competed at the inaugural U14 Boys State Titles competition in July.

In 2024, KNA would again – to have a KNA U14 Boys State Titles team. To build awareness, KNA have initiated a Boys Only U12-14 Boys Spring competition. We promoted heavily within the school networks – both public and private. The Beecroft & Hornsby North PSSA have dedicated Boys Netball Teams for their winter sport, which is a great start for engaging boys in netball. The Ku-Ring-gai PSSA (KPSSA) currently has mixed netball, with only 2-3 boys allowed per team. We are hoping that KPSSA will make the move to Boys Teams in the near future.

Our aim for the Boys Spring Comp was to be as flexible as possible, to manipulate the team size and competition to meet whatever number of boys were interested. At present, we have 18 boys registered to play in the boys only competition. The boy's range in experience from novice, to having played multiple years in mixed competitions and played the 2023 State Titles. There are a few more boys in U11/12 mixed spring comp.

For the boys' competition, each week the 3 teams of 6 will play 2x 20min games in a round robin (40min in total), with the team sitting out, being provided with a skills session to improve their skills and understanding of the game & rules. If we have more boys interested, the teams' size will increase from 5 to 6; and if more decide to play, we will expand to 4 teams of 5. We will continue to manipulate the teams and competition to ensure all boys can play, with minimal time off the court – maximizing experience and learning.

KNA have opened nominations for an U14 State Titles Team, however we won't be promoting that option further until the Spring Competition has commenced.

In Term 1, 2024, KNA will be investigating opportunities with KPSSA to conduct some training/ gameplay sessions for boys in Primary years 3-6. KNA would like to support KPSSA in developing their boys' netball teams for the PSSA winter competition. This would also be a pathway to promote interest in the U14s State Titles Team for July 2024. We currently have 6 nominations for the u14s Team and are keen to identify a few more.

To grow boys' netball, we need everyone in the KNA community to support and assist in promoting it. We have been overwhelmed by the support and positive feedback by many, however we still need to overcome some disappointing and negative attitudes such as “my boys aren't playing netball” and “netball isn't for boys”. Please help us to build awareness and to change these stereotyped mindsets. It is always so encouraging to hear the feedback from teen boys and men, who get have stepped out of the stereotypes and given it a go. They realize how much fun netball is and that it truly is a team game – you can't rely on 1 or 2 individual key players, because that just doesn't work in netball. So please encourage your sons, brothers, grandsons, and friends to give it a go and to smash through the stereotypes.

We'd love to see KNA enter a team into the 2024 U14 Boys State Titles.

You can help us do that!

We had a good reply to the following survey regarding continuous training, but finding a night and time to suit everyone was difficult. We did end up with 6-8 constant players, who may not have been able to make every week but came on a regular basis. The feedback from the regular players was very positive and they were all very keen to continue in 2024.

My suggestions would be that we should start the program before the season starts, in the same vein as we have the fitness sessions. It will always be an issue with training days and times when it comes to adults so if we can include availability days etc in the initial invite.

6.7 Fixtures Report:

For the 2023 season it was voted that the Winter season would start 2 weeks prior to the Autumn (April) school holidays, allowing the season to finish earlier and avoid cross over with other sports. This was adjusted after last year's later season start and issues with competing sporting timetables towards the end of the season. The Spring competition started after the Spring (October) school holidays to allow for day light savings to start and no cross over with Winter Season. It was reduced from a 10-week to 9-week fixture to allow it to end the first week of December, before private schools finished for the year and the busy December period started. The timing appears to have worked well this year.

Two rounds of the competition were allocated to a 'Supershot' game whereby goals shot from outside the inner circle counted as 2 points for 2 of the quarters. It has been requested that if this was to be repeated for the following season that teams be given more notification to prepare.

For the winter competition, where possible, if teams had a bye grade, we arranged a 'friendly' game with a team from another bye grade competition. This has been well received and meant that teams that otherwise would have missed out on 2 games for the season got to play a game every week. This is a good initiative to continue for coming seasons, where possible. Teams were asked if they wanted to participate which most agreed to do.

In rounds 6, 11 and 13, for all competitions except Cadets and the 3.40pm seniors' game, a lower grade competition played on the 'A' grade courts (1-4) and the A grade played on the courts that that grade usually played on. We started with the D grade, then C grade, then B grade. This allowed other grades to be on courts that are central to the complex and usually reserved for A grade. Feedback from these grades was positive.

KNA successfully held the NetSetGo Gala day, All Abilities Carnival, and Junior Gala Day. Numbers were down from previous years for the NSG and Junior Gala Days, and it was discovered the Junior



Gala Day was on the same day as the Wyong Carnival. Several associations send junior teams to the Wyong Carnival. We will need to ensure next season these two events aren't on the same day.

A voluntary extra round for 8-year-olds was added to their season where they played in the Thursday 9s competition as a 'welcome to 9s' to let these teams experience how the Thursday night competition runs. Similarly, a 'welcome to Canoon courts' volunteer round for 9s moving to 10s was added. Both very successful and gave players and parents an introduction to the competition the players will be moving into the following year.

6.9 Grading Report:

Winter Competition:

This season 260 teams (including KNA All Stars) registered from Net Set Go through to Seniors.

- Senior teams: 56
- Junior teams: 151 (10 years – Cadets)
- Net Set Go: 53 (6-9 years)

This year regrading was finalised after Game/Day 7 with 31 teams being regraded. Being 2 weeks later, it did have an effect on the ladder for many teams, as they could not make up the points if regraded as they would have if regrading was after day 5. Feedback received was that we must go back to regrading after day 5 next year.



NSG – Lofberg: Grading was better this year; however, it is still challenging when some teams can only play at certain times, due to other commitments & coaches' availability. All teams need to be more flexible.

Every year, clubs are always advised to register players in their appropriate age groups, but still a couple of clubs are not doing this, which then has consequences with allocating to grades/timeslots.

Spring Competition:

Numbers are up with 119 teams registered to play this year, including our inaugural Fathers/Daughters Competition. The ladies comp is still on the low side, having to again merge several grades this year. Hopefully with Lofberg being resurfaced, there will be more interest next year. Numbers were down only in Inters/Mixed.

Ladies Comp – 28 teams, Senior Mixed – 23 teams, Cadet Mixed – 7 teams, Inters/Mixed – 11 teams, 11/12 Years – 24 teams, 9/10 Years – 24 teams.

6.11 Marketing Report:

Communications Plan

I drew up a communications and PR Plan which prioritised and included all target audiences and corresponding activities and submitted it to the Executive Committee.

Sponsorship

December 2022 – January 2023

- Contacted sponsors whose agreements were about to expire to discuss renewal.
- Compiled and sent out a Sponsor's Newsletter listing key dates for 2023.
- Met with all sponsors.
- Updated Sponsorship and advertising material for 2023
- Contacted existing and potential newsletter advertisers.

Survey re discontinuing newsletter

As requested by Rod, during January I approached all KNA sponsors to elicit their response to a proposal that the KNA the newsletter be discontinued in its present format and discuss with them the resulting changes to the benefits agreed on in their existing sponsorship agreements.

I reported back to the Exec that, since all sponsor's benefits already included banners plus logos on letterheads, score sheets and social media, sponsors specifically wanted to know what KNA would be offering them instead of the adverts and write-ups they were receiving in the newsletter.

I requested details and suggested that I prepare a proposal outlining any changes/new benefits. The Exec subsequently decided not to pursue this avenue further and I advised all sponsors accordingly.

January – September 2023

During this period, I carried out the following activities:

- Sourced a sponsor to pay for umpire's shirts and umpire's committee jackets (The Source Bulk Foods -\$2500 plus GST)
- Sent out a 'key dates' newsletter to sponsors when the new calendar was finalised.
- Followed up with each sponsor on a regular basis to ensure that they were receiving - and were happy with - the benefits listed in their agreements.
- Reminded sponsors when their agreements were going to expire and secured updated agreements which were signed and retained by the KNA Treasurer. A copy was sent to the sponsor.
- Liaised with them about participating in Sponsor's Day, donating prizes for Crazy Hair & Sock Day and where relevant, discussed dates for their mailout to KNA members.
- Reminded them of newsletter deadlines and ensured that I had suitable editorial/pics for the newsletter from them.
- Assisted with editorial (writing or editing) if required.
- Provided newsletter page proofs when requested.
- Delivered or posted hard copies of each issue of the newsletter to them.
- Called them to discuss any opportunities/changes which may have arisen.
- Followed up with up Amber Tiles Hornsby whose sponsorship agreement needs to be renewed for next season. I have received no response from them and suggest that they be contacted early next year.
- In mid-2023 I learned that, during 2022 CMP had discussed sponsoring the newsletter if the



format could be changed to A4. I immediately secured agreement for the proposed change from sponsors and the final two issues of the 2023 newsletter came out as A4 publications. Had I been advised of this offer when it was first made, KNA could have saved on the cost of all four issues.

Sponsor's Day

- North Shore Orthodontics attended and gave away drink bottles. They also had a popcorn machine and ran a competition. I sent them photos for their social media.
- Belle Properties expressed an interest in attending but could not follow through as they have show houses on a Saturday.
- In addition, I briefed the photographer to take photos of the KSSP (physio) in action, as well as players in front of sponsor's banners. These were used in the newsletter, and I also sent them to Belinda Robson for social media.

Newsletters

The main developments in terms of the newsletter production, has been that:

- The format of the last two issues changed from A3 to A4 and production costs are now being sponsored by CMP (see details under sponsorship).
- Barbara Pope (who volunteered in the role of assistant for many years) was unable to continue in 2023 due to ill health.
- As a result, this year I have sourced the material, selected the photographs and written/edited, proofed and distributed the publication - which has not been ideal.
- Four issues of the newsletter were produced. Two A3 size at 16 pages each and two xA4 size of 20 pages each
- Aside from sponsors, we have two regular paying advertisers and, now that production costs are being sponsored, KNA could look into attracting others.
- As I have recommended previously, since hard copies of the newsletter are useful in attracting new sponsors and members to KNA - as well as promoting awareness of the Association's role in the local community - it would be a good idea to widen the distribution area rather than throwing excess copies away. I deliver hard copies of the newsletter to various shopping centres and supermarkets, and I once again suggest that Clubs take on a greater role in distributing copies in their areas.

Photographers

- I have booked and briefed the photographers as required for events.
- Monitored their hours and checked and signed off their invoices.
- Photos have been shared with Belinda for social media.

Advertising and social media

- Throughout the year I have worked with Pete on a regular basis to provide wording and develop a concept for a number of advertisements (vacancies) and announcements for social and other media (events).

6.12 Member Protection Report:

Consistent with Netball NSW's Member Protection Policy, the KNA is committed to ensuring that the safety and welfare of children is paramount.

The current season has been relatively quiet with respect to issues arising through the year, but I provide a brief summary below:

1. As you may recall, from 1 September 2022 changes were made to the legislation to create a national database of the working with children checks ('WWCC') which is called the National Reference System ('NRS'). The NRS was established by the Federal Government and is now managed by the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission.

During the year there was only one real issue in respect of whether a parent or guardian is required to secure a WWCC if, for example, coaching a team and if working in the canteen. The primary position is that there is no requirement under the legislation for a WWCC if a parent or close relative is coaching or working in the canteen. However, KNA determined that this did present a small gap with respect to the protective measures.

It was decided to err on the side of caution and if any person was involved in the coaching of a team (as a parent or close relative of a child in the team) that the person would be required to secure a WWCC. This decision did not extend to persons working in the canteen which was too difficult to police and manage.

This decision was taken to ensure the highest levels of protection are maintained in respect of child safety.

These days created a wonderful atmosphere for those in around the courts. The games were all played in tremendous spirit, and it was amazing to see all the players giving their all whilst also having fun and enjoying the experience at the same time. One of the great initiatives introduced this year was the opening of the Barbecue at the Canoon Rd on Thursday nights. This really brought the spirit of playing the sport of netball back together, something that was unfortunately hampered in recent times thanks to Covid-19. The barbecue offered a chance for the kids to stick around and spend time with their friends for a little bit longer, whilst also saving parents from making them dinner when they got back home. It is for this reason that we received lots of wonderful feedback from parents while at Lofberg on Thursday nights and we hope to see this initiative continued into season 2024.

With such an influx of young netballers joining clubs within the KNA, an introduction day to the sport of netball within the KNA district was ordained early in the season. This day was all about giving the kids and parents a taste for what KNA is all about. Hosted at Canoon, the day was a well-regarded success, with large numbers of young families coming to the day and participating in a range of different activities that offered an amazing welcome to not only netball but to the family of KNA. We received many thanks and some wonderful feedback from those that participated in the day and hopefully will have many more successful days like this in the years to come.

This day was also replicated again at the end of the year, with a welcome to Canoon day being for U9's experience what a day of netball will be like in 2024. These days are so vitally important to plant the seed in not only the players but their parents mind to participate in netball within the KNA for years to come and we will continue to run these at the back of the year. It is vital that KNA continues to run these events and foster a sense of community and connection amongst those that do so much for us.

We are so lucky to have amazing parents at KNA, who week-in-week-out support their kids from the sidelines and create an amazing atmosphere down at the Lofberg courts. The support from parents is something that does not go unnoticed, and it was something many staff/volunteers remarked to me throughout the season. Our umpires were awesome again this year and a massive thanks must go to our umpiring committee who work tirelessly to educate people new to the sport and help our young umpires with difficult situations that might occur throughout games.

However, we did have some issues with parents bringing dogs to Lofberg and being a bit too aggressive with umpires and their own children. In 2024, we hope to see this sort of behaviour eliminated from our courts as it takes away from the atmosphere that is created training sessions and Saturday games. For parents in the future, we will encourage that they do not challenge a young umpire on a decision made in the match, as the umpires are most likely young and still learning. We do not want to scare potential umpires, as good officials are hard to come by these days.

Court resurfacing and maintenance has recently been completed at Lofberg and is ready for the 2024 season. This will aid and ensure that our players are playing on the smoothest and safest courts, preventing potential injuries that would be so detrimental to such young people. I would also like to use this report to introduce the possible restructure of NSG moving forward



into the 2024 season. Whilst the idea of having a separate playing cohort to older netballers has worked efficiently and well, we are looking to transform the makeup of NSG. In particular, we are hoping to assist coaches and ease the pressure that is placed on them to teach the girls the basic netball fundamental. This will in turn improve the skills of players, meaning that hopefully more girls will play netball within KNA indefinitely.

NORTH SHORE UNITED

GENERAL OVERVIEW:

North Shore United (NSU) is an exciting joint venture partnership forged between Ku-ring-gai (KNA) and Northern Suburbs (NSNA) Netball Associations. Dynamic, innovative and with the backing of over 50 netball clubs and 10,000 members, NSU is providing pathways for talented netballers through to the elite level. NSU aims to become the North Shore's elite sporting team. Every week our Under 23's and Open's teams take on the best players in the State in the premier league competition.

Currently both the Under 23's and the Open's teams feature many of former KNA junior representative players Ash Fong, Jordyn Chue, Sarah Corfield, and Ella Johnson. Our under 23's team features Hannah Alexander, Zoe Huxtable, Mia McKenzie, Sarah Deffert and is coached by Colleen Mitchell. Jo-Ann Perry is the manager.

Current head coach of the Open's Dylan Nexhip is the Australian Men's Captain and was part of the Successful KNA Open Men's teams that won the 2022 State Championships title. Robyn Bramwell a KNA junior manager, manages the Open's team.

KNA chose to become part of this competition to provide access to an elite pathway for our players. This competition is seen as an important pathway in developing future Suncorp Super Netball and Diamonds players. Emily Moore a KNA junior and North Shore United player is now playing with the Queensland Firebirds in 2023. In addition to this the 2023 North Shore United squad features 5 players named in the 2023 Giants Academy and 2 players named in the Swifts Academy

In 2023 North Shore United continues to be a special Premier League Franchise that values excellence both on and off the court and thrives on developing connections with our grassroots netball communities.



North Shore United play a key part in the development of our players. Each school holidays NSU players and coaches provide coaching clinics for players to develop our junior players skills. Over 300 young players attended these clinics in 2023.

Many KNA Under 15's representative players and Metro League players are also part of the NSU Academy, a training program for 15-21 years olds that provides an insight into the high-performance training programs required for Premier League Netball.

This year saw a couple of new initiatives including 'NSU Day' at KNA - providing coaching clinics for KNA players and the KNA All Stars. NSU also hosted the first premier league 'Home Game' at Barker College attracting a crowd of over 270 supporters.

Season 2023

In 2023, NSU had an extremely successful year.

The Opens finished 2nd on the table at the end of the regular season however a defeat in the Preliminary Final saw the team come in 3rd position; a brilliant result for a team which saw players elevated from the U23's of 2022. The franchise is providing a fantastic pathway for our players. Our 23's team was at the forefront of player development and was considered by far the team with the strongest level of improvement throughout the season.

In 2023 the NSU Opens were also nominated as the Community Sporting team of the year at the 2023 NSW Community Sports Awards. It is a testament to the NSU Open's side that they were recognised for their professional approach to the game. They continue to excel at both on court excellence and off court initiatives which set aside North Shore United from other franchises.

NSU would like to acknowledge the great co-operation of the Metro coaches of both Associations for their co-operation and willingness to work with the NSU franchise.

Together, all the registrars have ensured the competitions have been a great success! It is sad however, seeing a decline in volunteers. This will have a dramatic effect on future costs and registrations. So, we all need to pull together and do whatever we can now to ensure that netball thrives, and it will only do so with your participation and time.

I have had the honour to serve as the volunteer KNA Senior Registrar for 10 years. And would like to thank everyone for their support over these past years. What an amazing association! Whilst I am stepping back, due to a sea change, I will continue to support KNA from a distance and am here if needed for any queries on procedures or general advice.

KNA is looking for anyone who would like to step up into the Registrar role. At least 4 people are required to make this job run smoothly. Club members, ask your mums who turn up every Saturday to support their children, ask members that play in the afternoon for a few hours. The more support the smoother the running.

Spring competition started well, and the figures are encouraging with the introduction of Father Daughter teams and an all-Boys competition. It is exactly what netball needs right now, a new burst of innovative competitions. With lights now available for evenings, and resurfaced courts at Lofberg, the expansion of mixed teams is encouraging for future competitions for Spring and Summer. Who's to say these competitions cannot move forward to the Winter seasons.

With the end of the year approaching fast, I would like to send out an early Merry Christmas to one and all. It has been a pleasure, and I am excited for KNA's future.

6.17 Rep Liaison Officer Report:

The Rep Liaison Committee consisting of Larissa Daniel, Melissa Costa and Lisa Julian provided valuable assistance in 2023 including organising BBQ rosters, tent distribution and returns and distributing uniforms to our players. I extend my thanks to these committee members for their ongoing support throughout the year and look forward to representation across all Junior Representative age groups for this committee in 2024.

After many years of working with Sydney Netball Shop for our KNA uniforms, the Rep Committee undertook a tender process to find a reliable supplier that could provide locally made uniforms from 2024. We received five tenders from NSW and Vic based organisations and have signed an agreement with ZBR Zibara, based on the Central Coast to provide our uniforms in 2024. We will see slight changes to some of our uniform items, direct online ordering, reduced stock holdings and quicker turnaround times, while maintaining similar price points on most items.

As part of this agreement, Zibara will provide uniforms for our KNA All Stars players. In addition, we will be working with Zibara to design and introduce a range of supporter apparel and merchandise to be available in 2024. We will consult with the wider KNA Committees to include umpire, Executive and other KNA uniforms and apparel under this arrangement.

Netball NSW announced dates and venues for HART Junior and Senior State Titles for both 2024 and 2025 and planning is underway for KNA Division 1 representation at all events.

6.18 Rep Selection Convenor's Report – Seniors:

2023 has been a highly successful year for the Senior Representative Program featuring some fantastic results by our Senior Representative teams and the second year of Men's competitions in the Netball NSW representative calendar.

Metro League 2023

The DOOLEYS Metro League is one of the top netball competitions in New South Wales, offering week in, week out competition for the state's most talented metro-based netballers, coaches, umpires, and administrators. The competition consists of 60 teams contesting 6 divisions and includes teams from the Hunter, Central Coast and Sydney metro-based associations.

Our KNA teams compete against some of the most talented netballers in the state over an 18-week season held at Netball Central. All teams performed exceptionally well this season and played with determination, great sportsmanship, and pride in representing KNA.

The season resulted in some great successes for our KNA teams. Our Team 1 (Div 1) team finished the round competition in 6th place. Our team 2 (Div 3) team finished in 8th position having some very successful results and wins over many of the top 4 teams. Our Team 3 (Div 5) team had a strong season finishing in 5th place.

In 2023 KNA became one of 7 associations to have the maximum of 4 teams competing in the Metro League Competition. 6.20 Spring Competition Report:

My name is Robyn Rowland, and I am the Spring Competition Convenor for 2023 season. I have run several sport competitions with 3 x spring netball competitions, this being my 4th.

There are 118 teams playing in the Spring competition. We started a Boy's only division with the wonderful work of Kelly Norris who spent many hours on foot and emails, calls to PSSA schools in the area to get our first Boys' competition up and running. Additionally, we started our father/daughter's competition with 4 teams. Our KNA President Rod Jackson plays in this competition with his daughter and has said it is fun with some competitive attitudes. A professional photographer will be on sight to photograph teams and players for our socials.

I had many individuals looking for teams and teams looking for players. The majority were placed into teams. As late as last week 2 players on my list looking for a team were placed into a team.

Feedback on Lofberg court surfacing has been very positive. There was a problem with one light broken but has now been fixed with the thanks to Ruth Jang, KNA Court Bookings following up with council.

A WhatsApp chat group was established for Spring Comp umpires. It helps teams looking for an umpire and umpires looking for teams to umpire and has been so successful. This platform allows teams to find a last-minute umpire due to sickness, injury or predicaments from umpires that can't make their scheduled game.

Some problems that occurred and have been sorted:

- There was one issue week 2 with the lights not coming on at Lofberg via the pin number organized with council which meant a portion of a time slot played in some poor light.
- There was an incident with a fatality on the main roads that held up teams getting to game and the problem was solved by delaying the games up to 15 minutes. This was announced on socials and our WhatsApp chat.

My feedback

- ✓ I am so delighted to be working with the KNA committee to organize this competition. It has been a truly positive experience with a 'get the job done pronto' attitude in all the roles. I am so impressed with everyone's ability to own their volunteer role so proudly and communicate with all to make it all happen on time.
- ✓ Furthermore, the KNA managers of the KNA website and socials have been supportive. When I asked for an advert, it was back in my email completed in less than 20 mins, sometimes quicker. I have worked in businesses and asked for the same and KNA provided this faster.
- ✓ Thank you to all the club Registrars, some Secretaries and all other roles who have communicated with me as you have been so efficient, polite, and thankful.
- ✓ Supervisors at the venues are on a *WhatsApp* chat to communicate with myself, Katie Bonjer (fixtures), Ruth Jang (Court Bookings) and David Funk (Grounds). This has been successful for shout outs and information with speedy replies to help. We have 3 Competition Supervisors who can support each other in the event someone is sick or away. Those dates have been identified.
- ✓ I understand KNA recognize that the Spring Competition should be run at Canoon Courts, under lights. This would mean the competition could be run over fewer nights and with more



courts to allow early starts for more ages wanting to play and allowing for less late games. Without the use of Canoon Courts the draw must be worked over 4 nights to accommodate all teams in divisions. My understanding from the KNA Committee is that there are council restrictions on using the lights outside of the winter season due to noise and traffic restrictions enforced by residents. I believe this is a continued subject addressed at council. It would certainly be an easier and more efficient competition to run if it could all be run at Canoon Courts for over say 2 nights only. Meaning less volunteers needed and efficiency of maximizing other KNA volunteers.

6.21 Umpire Convenor's Report:

Season Overview

The 2023 Season for umpires contained many positives and highlighted some areas to focus on developing in 2024. We had a number of experienced Club Convenors finish up in their roles at the end of 2022 and as such 2023 contained a majority new cohort of Club Umpire Convenors.

Additionally, the retirement of Alan as Umpire's Convenor and addition of new committee members signalled a shift in the dynamics and experiences of the KNA Umpire's Committee. Despite these changes, the team that supports umpires at club and association level efficiently and effectively adapted, developed, and combined from week one and throughout the season.

Furthermore, we thank and farewell Ally Gill as Umpire's Convenor at the conclusion of the 2023 season.

2023 New Initiatives

Thanks to the hard work of the KNA Sponsorship portfolio the umpiring committee was given jackets sponsored by The Source Bulk Foods St Ives. This has helped identify KNA Committee members quickly at the courts and helped us to be a safe figure for umpires to seek assistance from. Thank you to Rhoda and The Source Bulk Foods for this investment in umpires.

2023 also signalled the first year of KNA Junior Umpire shirts. These were distributed to new umpires to wear over club uniforms at the beginning of the season. These shirts had a two-pronged benefit: to provide new umpires a uniform to wear prior to earning their club uniforms upon receipt of district badges and to remind players and spectators that just like the players these umpires are learning and new at their craft. We look forward to developing this initiative in 2024, specifically increasing public awareness of the shirts.

The final new initiative for this year was the Supershot Rounds that required significant prep and input from the Executive alongside the Umpires. Together we wrote the rule, managed different aged games, and communicated and equipped umpires for this rule change. We hope and expect that as many umpires have now umpired this (as well as played these rounds) that we will see growing confidence and ease in managing Supershot Rounds from Umpires in 2024.

NSW Recognition

The Premier Metro League competition featured nine umpires (two more than 2023), with Sarah Dahdah (KP) successfully appointed to Tier 4 for the first time. A number of these umpires were selected for Finals series and additional training games offered by NSW throughout the season.

At Senior State Titles we supplied 15 umpires covering KNA allocations and 2 other associations. Additionally, at Junior State Titles we supplied 37 umpires covering KNA allocations and 7 other associations.

Following her performance at 2023 NSW events, Emily Hall (STI) was included in the NSW Developing Umpires Group this year.

Shauna Winchester (STI) was one of four NSW umpires selected to officiate the Australian Netball Championships, signalling her third selection in a row for the new format of a Suncorp Netball feeder competition.

Maddi Lee-Joe (WP) and Cayleigh Hartwig (BER) were selected for Sydney Academy as umpires and recently at Academy Games were awarded their National B badges.

From Junior and Senior State four KNA umpires were offered positions in the Summer Series pool and a further three were accepted following KNA nominations.



Areas for 2024 Focus and Development

With the release of new rules from the International Netball Federation for 2024 and beyond significant energy will need to be focused on teaching and equipping umpires, players and coaches to understand and implement the new rules.

Furthermore, the impact of COVID restrictions on training effective buddies has been exposed throughout the 2023 season and plans are currently being built to remedy and improve this limitation.

We are thankful for updates to the umpiring software that have been generated by David Funk and look forward to using these effectively in the 2024 season.

Finally, over the past few years there has been an exponential increase in spectator/coach/player and umpire incidents. Whilst there is encouragement that a number of other associations and sports have reported similar increases, this will need to be an area of focus for 2024 and beyond, for member protection, positive culture and given the loss of umpires not returning as a result of said incidences.

We have a great KNA committee who support a cohort of enthusiastic umpires and with the support of all concerned the future looks bright for KNA, but we can't emphasise enough how important it is that we look after, support and protect them, our game depends on them.

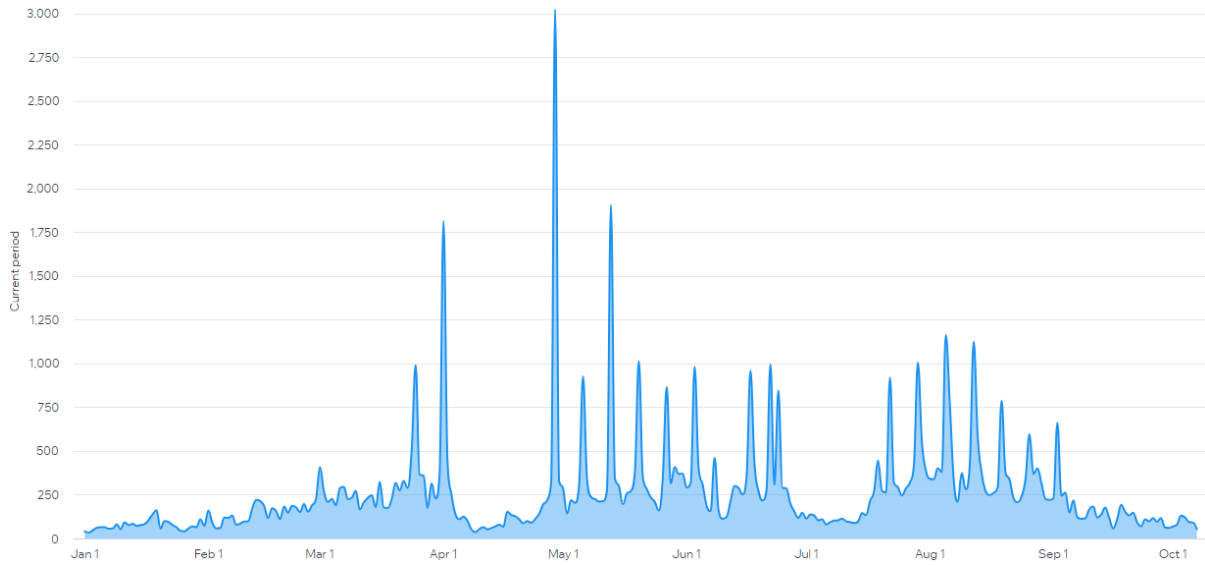
6.22 Web Administrator's Report

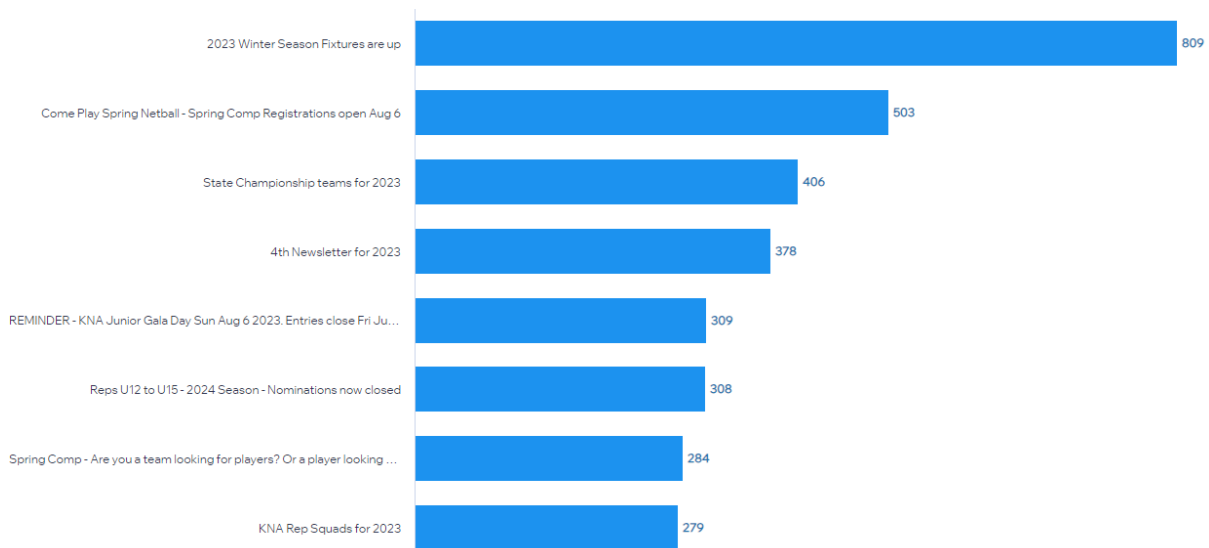

Suggestion at SGM that all clubs shall be given more flexibility with transferring of players for the finals. Clubs to be allowed the transfer of players that may not have had the opportunity to play the required minimum 3 games (especially if they are the same age and had to play their own games at the same time slot.

Three different by laws affect how players can be borrowed and transferred. 11(i) 13(e) & 15 (i) It is suggested that changes should be trialled in the 2024 season before the by-laws are amended. Our current Winter Competition guidelines already allow for borrowing across grades except in the A divisions both from within clubs and across clubs.

Option 1.

Borrowing guidelines as stated in the KNA Winter Comp borrowing guidelines will apply throughout the season and during the finals' series.

The borrowing club must confirm all details to the KNA Grading Convenor and KNA Registrar in writing if a player is borrowed. The borrowing club must provide details on the scoresheets.

Option 2.

To be eligible for the final series a player needs to have played at least two (2) games or parts thereof. The transfer of any player needs KNA Grading Committee approval.

In exceptional circumstances a club may request permission for one (1) player per team to play in 2 finals matches. Consideration of exceptional circumstances will only be given when a team and club can clearly demonstrate that they have tried to plan for all contingencies.

Option 3.

Borrowing guidelines remain as written in the 2023 winter guidelines with emphasis given to the guideline which states that "Any special borrowing requests should be put in writing for consideration to the KNA Grading Convenor".

Option 1 ignores all three by laws, Option 2 ignores 2 of them and Option 3 abides by all.
