


GOAL SHOOTER

Where can a GS play?




The Goal Shooter's (GS) main job is to shoot goals.

A GS works closely with the GA to try to get as close as possible to the post so that there is more of a chance to get the goal in.

A GS must always try to get the rebound if they miss a goal.


If the other team gets the ball, the GS must stick close to the GK and try to win the ball back.

Where can a GA play?




The Goal Attack's (GA) main job is to shoot goals with the GS.

A GA must always try to get the rebound if they miss a goal.


If the other team gets the ball, the GA must stick close to the GD and try to win the ball back.

WING ATTACK

Where can a WA play?




The Wing Attack's (WA) main job is to break for the centre pass.

The WA helps pass the ball from the centre third into the goal third and finally into the GS and GA.

The WA takes throw ins, free passes and penalty passes in their goal third.


If the other team gets the ball, the WA must stick close to the WD and try to win the ball back.

CENTRE

Where can a C play?




The Centre's (C) main job is to take the centre pass alternatively with other team.

The C links the play from the defence end to the attack end. Most of their work should be done in the centre third. They should be careful not to crowd areas by trying to get every pass.

The C takes throw ins, free passes and penalty passes in their goal third.


If the other team gets the ball, the C must stick close to the other C and try to win the ball back.

WING DEFENCE

Where can a WD play?




The Wing Defence's (WD) main job is to win the ball back by sticking close to the WA.

The WD stops the WA from ever getting a pass.

The WD takes throw ins, free passes and penalty passes in the centre third.


The WD helps breaks for throw ins by their own GK on a goal line throw in.

Where can a GD play?




The Goal Defence's (GD) main job is to win the ball back and stop the GA from shooting any goals.

The GD takes throw ins, free passes and penalty passes in the centre third.


The GD must also strive hard for rebounds if the shooters miss a goal.

GOAL KEEPER

Where can a GK play?



The Goal Keeper's (GK) main job is to win the ball back and stop the GS from shooting any goals.

The GK does tight man-to-man defence on the GS so that they cannot get a pass from their team.

The GK takes throw ins, free passes and penalty passes in the opposition's goal third.

The GK must also strive hard for rebounds if the shooters miss a goal.
